

Hotel Information for September 18-19, 2008

Hotels and motels in Louisville have been virtually filled for the night of September 18th for more than a year because of the Ryder Cup, which begins on the 19th. The few Louisville rooms that *are* still available are renting for several times their regular rate and generally have a 3-day minimum stay. **Remaining rooms in Louisville and even beyond are going quickly. You will have your best chance of booking a room if you make your reservations immediately.**

The Jameson Inn, Louisville South (502 / 968-4100), is holding a few rooms for September 18th only at \$260 for conference participants. (They are reserved under the name of Energizing Kentucky and U of L.) The Ramada Inn Downtown, located just off the first exit of I-71, near the Water Tower, is holding a few rooms for conference participants for September 18th only at \$348. At the time of posting, there are still rooms available for September 18th only at the Louisville Holiday Inn-Southwest (502 / 448-2020) for \$378.

The Henry Clay building, where the conference is taking place, is only a few blocks from the entry ramp to I-75 South. Motel rooms are much more available for September 18th only at less inflated prices in locations less than 40 minutes away on or near this interstate. For example, at the time of posting rooms were available at the following locations:

- Radcliff Holiday Inn Express (270 / 352-4329) - \$108
- Radcliff Econolodge Fort Knox (270 / 351-4488) - \$79
- Radcliff/Fort Knox Super 8 (270 / 352-1888) - \$80.

At posting, some rooms were available at the Shelbyville Days Inn for \$145.

Free Parking for The Henry Clay Building

Directly across the street from The Henry Clay Building, on the corner of South Third and Chesnut Streets, is a self-pay parking lot. Anyone attending *Energizing Kentucky* may park free in this lot on Thursday evening and also on Friday until the conference concludes.
